25kW consumers: Nepra asked to scrap application fee

ISLAMABAD: Acting on the direction of Federal Minister for Power Sardar Awais Ahmed Khan Leghari, the Power Division has formally asked NEPRA to abolish the application fee and remove the license requirement for solar consumers of 25 kilowatts and below.
