## Pakistan-US trade deal: Aurangzeb declines to disclose 'key details'

ISLAMABAD: Weeks after 'hastily' finalising a trade agreement with the United States – labelled as a significant boost to bilateral trade and investment – Federal Minister for Finance Muhammad Aurangzeb on Wednesday declined to disclose key details of the deal, raising concerns about transparency and potential hidden costs.

## PM vows to provide facilities to Japanese investors

## Ogra comes under fire for 'diverting' public funds

ISLAMABAD: The Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra), the country's key energy regulator, came under fire on Wednesday after it was found to have diverted over Rs1.4 billion public funds into short-term investments, violating legal requirements to deposit surplus receipts into the federal consolidated fund.

# <u>Digitally ordered goods, services: Pakistan taxman tells online marketplaces to submit monthly statements</u>

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has issued monthly statement to be submitted by online marketplaces against digitally ordered goods and services. The FBR has also issued a quarterly statement to be submitted by courier or a payment intermediary, responsible for collecting or deducting tax.

## Monsoon to be 22pc more stronger next year?

NEW DELHI: The immediate impact of U.S. tariffs on Indian exports appears limited, but the ripple effects on the economy pose challenges that must be addressed, India's finance ministry said in its July monthly economic review, released on Wednesday.

## Spot rate loses Rs100 per maund

LAHORE: The Spot Rate Committee of the Karachi Cotton Association (KCA) on Wednesday reduced the spot rate by Rs 100 per maund and closed it at Rs 16,100 per maund. # Trump slaps India with 50pc tariffs, upending ties with Modi

WASHINGTON: President Donald Trump imposed a crushing 50 per cent tariff on Indian goods to punish the country for buying Russian oil, upending a decades-long push by Washington to forge closer ties with New Delhi, according to Bloomberg.

## China reaffirms strategic partnership, vows full support to Pakistan

BEIJING: China has reaffirmed its unwavering commitment to Pakistan's economic progress and strategic stability, stressing that the country is steadily advancing on the path of development and that its future will continue to improve.

## Exports to US surge 40pc in July

KARACHI: Exports to the US recorded a sharp 40 per cent increase in July, driven by strong demand for textile products in the US retail sector and the carryover of shipments from June of the previous fiscal year, according to data released by the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) on Wednesday.

## LCCI warns of severe water shortage, flood losses

LAHORE: President of the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI) Mian Abuzar Shad has said that the lack of sufficient water reservoirs and a rapidly declining storage capacity have left the nation unable to fully meet its agricultural, energy and domestic needs.

## FPCCI urges immediate restoration of SRO 760 to save gold jewellery exports

KARACHI: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI) has formally written to Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, seeking the immediate restoration of SRO 760 to help fulfil pending export orders and support the country's gold jewellery sector.

## Analysts say US tariffs could put 2m jobs in India at risk

WASHINGTON/NEW DELHI: US President Donald Trump's doubling of tariffs on imports from India to as much as 50 per cent could dent India's job market, fear analysts. "Up to 2 million jobs are at risk in the near term," said Sujan Hajra, chief economist at the Anand Rathi Group.

## Gold rates rise Rs1,000 per tola

KARACHI: Gold prices increased by Rs1,000 per tola on Wednesday in the local market following an increase in the international market. The All Pakistan Sarafa Gems and Jewellers Association said that 24-karat gold rates reached Rs361,700 per tola.
