FBR faces Rs42bn gap amid tax slowdown

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) missed its revenue collection target by nearly Rs42 billion in the first two months of the current fiscal year, mainly due to a decline in domestic sales tax collections. Between July and August, FBR collected Rs1.657 trillion, falling short of the target of Rs1.699tr.

Weak RLNG demand fuels circular debt in gas sector: study

KARACHI: The sharp rise in circular debt in Pakistan's gas sector is being driven by weakening demand for RLNG in the power sector, diversion of costly RLNG to households at subsidised rates, and persistent unaccounted-for gas (UFG) losses, a study has revealed.

PM reaches China to attend SCO summit

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif arrived in Tianjin, China, on Saturday to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit, the 80th anniversary of the victory in the Chinese People's War, and other official engagements in Beijing.

Solar push sparks 68pc rise in lithium battery imports

KARACHI: Pakistan's imports of lithium-ion batteries from China have surged to high levels in the first half of 2025, trade data shows. In his post on X on Friday, Head of Research at 'Business Recorder' Zuhair Abbasi shared data from the ITC and explained that Pakistan imported 68 per cent more lithium batteries from China in just six months of 2025 than it did in the entire 2024.

Pakistan secures four-year extension for fish exports to US

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Maritime Affairs Muhammad Junaid Anwar Chaudhry on Saturday announced that the United States has granted Pakistan a four-year extension to continue exporting fish and fish-related products.

Pakistan's surging used car imports pose threat: report

Pakistan's soaring used car imports pose a "serious" threat to local manufacturers, according to Indus Motor Co, the local joint venture of Toyota Motor Corp, reports Bloomberg. The roughly 40,000 to 45,000 imported vehicles comprised almost one-third of the local automobile market in the 12 months through June, compared with less than 10 per cent in 2023,
