Re0.41 decline

KARACHI: Rupee depreciated further against the US dollar in the inter-bank market as it lost Re0.41 or 0.15% during the previous week. The local unit closed at 284.87, against 284.46 it had closed the week earlier against the greenback, according to SBP.

Weekly Cotton Review: Market witnesses overall decline in prices

KARACHI: According to Head Transfer of Technology Central Cotton Research Institute Multan Sajid Mahmood, cotton production across the country has decreased by 33% compared to last year, with Sindh being the most affected region. The market saw an overall decline in cotton prices, with rates dropping by Rs. 200 to Rs. 400 per maund in both Sindh and Punjab. In Punjab, cotton prices ranged between Rs. 16,400 to Rs. 16,700 per maund.

Two USAID programmes partially restored in Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: The United States has resumed USAID funding to Pakistan after a pause earlier this year. Islamabad has already received grants under two key programs: the US Need-Based Merit Scholarships (Phase-II) and the FATA Infrastructure Program, with funding continuing until June 2025, according to sources.

Payment of dues to IPPs: Govt in a quandary over CPEC power plants

ISLAMABAD: The government finds itself on a tightrope when it comes to making payments among IPPs the amount of Rs1,275 billion acquired through loans from 18 commercial banks to erase the circular debt in power sector once and for all, as Chinese IPPs installed under CPEC umbrella that have not agreed to revise their power purchase agreements (PPAs) cannot be ignored while making payments.

FBR imposes green levy to push Evs

ISLAMABAD: In a bid to accelerate the adoption of electric vehicles (EVs) and energyefficient transportation, the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has imposed Energy Vehicle Adoption Levy on all locally manufactured, assembled and imported vehicles that run on traditional internal combustion engines (ICE).
