## <u>Jul-Oct trade deficit jumps 39pc to USD12.7bn YoY</u>

ISLAMABAD: Negative growth in all major exportable categories apart from textile and an upsurge in petroleum imports ballooned the trade deficit to USD12.7 billion, showing an increase of 39 percent in the July-October period of 2025-26.

## PKR: marginal improvement

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee recorded marginal improvement against the US dollar as it appreciated 0.01 percent in the inter-bank market on Tuesday. At close, the currency settled at 280.67, a gain of Re0.04 against the greenback. On Monday, the local unit closed at 280.71.

## **Gold prices slump**

KARACHI: Local and international markets saw a slump in gold prices on Tuesday, as global bullion prices hovered near USD 4,000 per ounce, traders said. Gold prices in the local market plunged by Rs7,000 to Rs423,622 per tola and Rs6,002 to Rs363,221 per 10 grams, according to the All Pakistan Sarafa Gems and Jewellers Association.

## **Volume of business improves on cotton market**

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Tuesday remained steady and the trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told Business Recorder that the local cotton market. ## **Textile exports drift lower for third month**

ISLAMABAD: Amid growing concerns over the country's export performance, Pakistan's textile and clothing sector recorded a 0.67 per cent decline in October, which was the third straight month of negative growth, signalling persistent challenges in one of the country's key industries.

## Textile exports dip in October

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's textile exports edged down in October 2025, slipping 0.57 percent to \$1.616 billion, even as the sector showed a modest rebound from the previous month, official data showed Tuesday. The month-on-month improvement, a 2.78 percent rise from September's \$1.57 billion, offered some relief to exporters, but the year-on-year picture remained weak.

## Punjab cotton share falls to 44pc from 70pc

LAHORE: Punjab's cotton production continues to hit rock bottom, with the province's share in national output plummeting from the historic 70 per cent to just 44 per cent as growers struggle through historically low prices.

#### Power bills could rise in 2026 as Nepra reviews rates

ISLAMABAD: Pakistani households and industries may see electricity bills climb next year as the country's power regulator on Tuesday began reviewing a proposal to raise the national power purchase price, a move that could push energy costs higher across the board.
