#### PKR: marginal improvement

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee recorded marginal improvement against the US dollar in the interbank market on Wednesday. At close, the currency settled at 280.66, a gain of Re0.01 against the greenback. On Tuesday, the local unit closed at 280.67.

#### Moderate business on cotton market

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Wednesday remained steady and the trading volume remained moderate. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told Business Recorder that the rate of new cotton in Sindh is in between Rs 14,750 to Rs 15,800 per maund and the rate of cotton in Punjab is in between Rs 15,000 to Rs 16,000 per maund.

#### 'Pakistan needs to 'do more' ahead of GSP+ review'

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan needs to "do more" to meet its commitments under the GSP+ preferential tariff scheme, Eur-opean Union Ambassador to Pakistan Raimundas Karoblis said on Wedn-esday, ahead of a review. In an interview with DawnNewsTV, Amba-s-s-a-dor Karoblis was asked whether Pakistan needed to do more to fulfil the scheme's requirements. "Yes, we are saying that," he replied. "We are saying that it should be, well, needs to be, to do more."

#### Big industry output expands 2.7pc in September

ISLAMABAD: The Large-Scale Manu-facturing (LSM) sector grew 2.69 per cent year-on-year in September, indicating a possible recovery in the country's industrial production. The slight rebound from the previous month's sluggish growth offers a glimmer of hope amid ongoing economic challenges, according to figures released by the PBS on Wednesday.

#### Foreign loan inflows surge 33pc in July-Oct

ISLAMABAD: Foreign loan inflows to Pakistan increased by more than 33 per cent to \$2.293 billion in the first four months of 2025-26, mainly on the back of support from the International Monetary Fund (IMF). This allowed the government to begin the new fiscal year on a positive note, unlike last year's weak start due to the absence of IMF support.

#### Profit repatriation jumps 39pc in four months

KARACHI: Repatriation of profits and dividends on foreign investments during the first four months of the current fiscal year (FY26) rose by 39 per cent compared to the same period last year. The State Bank's latest data, issued on Wednesday, showed that outflows during July-October FY26 reached \$1,137 million, up from \$818m last year,

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has so far received dollar inflows in the shape of foreign loans to the tune of \$2.29 billion in the first four months (July-Oct) period of current fiscal year against \$1.72 billion in the same period of last financial year.

# IMF: Pakistan loses up to 6.5% of GDP to corruption as elite capture strangles growth
