2MFY26: Textile exports slump swells trade deficit to USD6bn

ISLAMABAD: A decline in textile exports in August of the 2025-26 fiscal year swelled the trade deficit to USD 6 billion in the first two months of the ongoing financial year, as the majority of textile sub-sectors showed a negative growth.

July FY26: LSM sector grows 9pc YoY

ISLAMABAD: The Large-Scale Manufacturing (LSM) sector showed a growth of almost 9 percent in July of the 2025-26 fiscal year on a year-on-year (YoY) basis, mainly on the back of the robust performance of the textile sector.

Aug private sector credit rises 15pc YoY

KARACHI: Credit to the private sector posted robust year-on-year growth of over 15 percent in August 2025, driven by easing financial conditions, improving economic activity and continued decline in budgetary borrowing.

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee maintained its positive momentum against the US dollar, appreciating marginally in the inter-bank market on Tuesday.
