DGTO grants APCAA 60 days to amend its bylaws

KARACHI: While dismissing the complaints challenging Arshad Khurshid as Chairman of the All Pakistan Customs Agents Association (APCAA), the Directorate General of Trade Organisations (DGTO) has given APCAA 60 days to formally amend its bylaws to include the new definition and evidentiary standards.

Super tax case: taxpayers' lawyer argues as SC hears FBR appeals

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court was told that Super Tax under Section 4C cannot be imposed by disallowing carried forward losses, admissible expenses, and depreciation allowance, as this would mean a simultaneous imposition under entries 47 and 52, which is not permissible under the Constitution.

Govt raises Rs976bn via T-bills, bonds

KARACHI: The government raised Rs976 billion through auctions of Treasury bills (T-bills) and Pakistan Investment Bonds (PIBs) on Wednesday, though cut-off yields remained largely unchanged.

Public debt hits Rs80.6tr despite lower interest costs

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's total public debt rose by 13 per cent to Rs80.6 trillion by the end of FY25, driven mainly by a fiscal deficit of Rs7.1tr and slower-than-expected GDP growth, according to the Ministry of Finance (MoF).

Inflation rebounds to 5.6pc on food price surge

ISLAMABAD: Inflation, measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), rose to 5.6 per cent in September, up from 3pc in August, marking a sharp increase driven by rising prices of perishable goods, according to official data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) on Wednesday.

New safety standards for vehicles enforced

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Industries and Production has enforced quality and safety standards for both imported and locally manufactured vehicles for the first time, amid concerns from auto industry stakeholders.

'Logistics inefficiencies hamper trade', says FPCCI

KARACHI: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI) has identified the logistics sector as a major structural constraint to trade and investment, with inefficiencies costing the economy significantly more than in advanced economies.

Gold skyrockets to Rs410,278 per tola

KARACHI: The prices of one-tola and 10-gram gold (24k) rose to an all-time high of Rs410,278 and Rs351,747, respectively, on Monday, increasing by Rs3,500 and Rs3,001 compared to Saturday.

Suzuki raises price of discontinued Ravi

KARACHI: Pak Suzuki Motor Company Ltd (PSMCL) has increased the price of its discontinued Suzuki Ravi model by Rs100,000, taking the new ex-factory rate to Rs2.075 million, up from Rs1.975m.

Aurangzeb rules out mini-budget for now

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue, Muhammad Aurangzeb, said Wednesday no proposal for taking any additional revenue measures in a mini-budget was under consideration at the moment.

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court (SC) was told on Wednesday that it is a general principle that a taxpayer can choose to pay tax under one of two similar laws, and that double taxation cannot be imposed on a taxpayer.

Off-grid levy costs gas sector Rs110bn

ISLAMABAD: A key energy sector reform, implemented under the guidance of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), has caused a staggering Rs110 billion loss in Pakistan's gas sector, while delivering only Rs35 billion in revenue, it is learnt.

Govt aims to raise Rs6.5tr via T-bills and bonds in October-December

KARACHI: The government plans to borrow Rs6.5 trillion from banks through Treasury bills and bonds during the second quarter of the fiscal year 2026 amid a tight fiscal position, the latest auction calendar issued by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) showed.

SBP buys \$7.7bn from currency market in FY25

KARACHI: Pakistan's central bank purchased \$7.7 billion from the currency market in the fiscal year that ended in June to bolster foreign exchange reserves and repay foreign debt.

Finance czar vows to lift tax take to 11% of GDP despite shortfall
